C. General Conditions Under Massachusetts Wetland Protection Act

(only applicable to approved projects)

1. Failure to comply with all conditions stated herein, and with all related statutes and other regulatory measures shall be deemed cause to revoke or modify this Order.
2. The Order does not grant any property rights or any exclusive privileges, it does not authorize any injury to private property or invasion of private rights.
3. This Order does not relieve the permittee or any other person of the necessity of complying with all other applicable federal, state, or local statutes, ordinances, bylaws or regulations.
4. The work authorized hereunder shall be completed within three years from the date of this Order unless either of the following apply:
 - (a) the work is a maintenance dredging project as provided for in the Act; or
 - (b) the time for completion has been extended to a specified date more than three years, but less than five years, for the date of issuance. If this Order is intended to be valid for more than three years, the extension date and the special circumstances warranting the extended time period are set forth as a special condition in this Order.
5. This Order may be extended by the issuing authority for one or more periods of up to three years each upon application to the issuing authority at least 30 days prior to the expiration date of the Order.
6. Any fill used in connection with this project shall be clean fill. Any fill shall contain no trash, refuse, rubbish or debris, including but not limited to lumber, bricks, plaster, wire, lath, paper, cardboard, pipe, tires, ashes, refrigerators, motor vehicles, or parts of any of the foregoing.
7. This Order does not become final until all administrative appeal periods from this Order have elapsed, or if such an appeal has been taken, until all proceedings before the Department have been completed.
8. No work shall be undertaken until the Order has become final and then has been recorded in the Registry of Deeds or the Land Court for the district in which the land is located, within the chain of title of the affected property. In the case of recorded land, the final Order shall also be noted in the Registry's Grantor Index under the name of the owner of the land upon which the proposed work is to be done. In the case of registered land, the Final Order shall also be noted on the Land Court Certificate of Title of the owner of the land upon which the proposed work is done. The recording information shall be submitted to this Conservation Commission on the form at the end of this Order which form must be stamped by the Registry of Deeds, prior to the commencement of work.
9. A sign shall be displayed at the site not less than two square feet or more than three square feet in size bearing the words,

10. Where the Department of Environmental Protection is requested to issue a Superseding Order, the Conservation Commission shall be a party to all agency proceedings and hearings before DEP.
11. Upon completion of the work described herein, the applicant shall submit a Request for Certificate of Compliance (WPA Form 8A) to the Conservation Commission.
12. The work shall conform to the plans and special conditions referenced in this order.
13. Any changes to the plans identified in Condition #12 above shall require the applicant to inquire of the Conservation Commission in writing whether the change is significant enough to require the filing of a new Notice of Intent.
14. The Agent or members of the Conservation Commission and Department of Environmental Protection shall have the right to enter and inspect the area subject to this Order at reasonable hours to evaluate compliance with the conditions stated in this Order, and may require the submittal of any data deemed necessary by the Conservation Commission or Department for that evaluation.
15. This Order of Conditions shall apply to any successor interest or successor in control of the property subject to this Order and to any contractor or other person performing work conditioned by this Order.
16. Prior to the start of work, and if the project involves work adjacent to a Bordering Vegetated Wetland, the boundary of the wetland in the vicinity of the proposed work area shall be marked by wooden stakes or flagging. Once in place, the wetland boundary markers shall be maintained until a Certificate of Compliance has been issued by the Conservation Commission.
17. All sedimentation barriers shall be maintained in good repair until all disturbed areas have been fully stabilized with vegetation or other means. At no time shall sediments be deposited in a wetland or water body. During construction, the applicant or his/her designee shall inspect the erosion controls on a daily basis and shall remove accumulated sediments as needed. The applicant shall immediately control any erosion problems that occur at the site and shall also immediately notify the Conservation Commission, which reserves the right to require additional erosion and/or damage prevention controls it may deem necessary. Sedimentation barriers shall serve as the limit of work unless another limit of work line has been approved by this Order.
18. All work associated with this Order is required to comply with the Massachusetts Stormwater Policy Standards.

ORDER OF CONDITIONS FOR LAKE SHIRLEY, LUNENBURG/SHIRLEY - AMENDED
(#284-384)

The Amendment issued on December 18, 2006, extends the expiration date of this Order to October 30, 2009, unless further extended. All conditions below remain in effect. The starred conditions were amended and/or added as part of the December 18, 2006 amendment.

Original Findings: The applicant would like to initiate drawdown as soon as possible, since the existing dam limits the rate of outflow. The Shirley Conservation Commission in an effort to work with the applicant has issued this Order of Conditions allowing the drawdown; however, the Commission is limiting that approval to one year. The applicant will request an amendment and provide additional information as part of the public hearing process. The Shirley Conservation Commission may allow a deeper drawdown and additional drawdown in subsequent years if enough information is provided to indicate that impacts to wetland resource areas and their interests are mitigated.

The Shirley Conservation Commission finds that the applicant must adhere to the following special conditions regarding this project.

Please review the preceding General Conditions on the DEP form (Conditions 1-17), particularly Condition 1.

- *18. The water level of Lake Shirley shall be drawdown no more than 3 feet during the 2006/2007 season unless this Order is further amended. This condition is amended to allow a 6-foot drawdown during 2006/2007 contingent upon conformance with all other conditions.
- 19. The Shirley Conservation Commission shall be notified in writing at least 24 hours prior to the start of drawdown.
- 20. Notification shall also be made in writing once the drawdown is complete and when the refilling of the lake begins and ends.
- *21. Refilling of the lake shall be complete no later than April 1, 2007. In subsequent years, the lake shall be refilled by April 1.
- *22. Drawdown may extend beyond the December 1st guideline in the "Eutrophication and Aquatic Plant Management in Massachusetts Final Generic Environmental Impact Report" (GEIR); however, all other recommended guidelines shall be followed. Drawdown on subsequent seasons may begin no earlier than October 8, although waiting until November 1 is preferred.
- *23. Outflow during refilling shall be kept above a discharge equivalent to 0.5 cubic feet per second per square mile of watershed (7.3 cfs). If refilling is not completed by April 1 of any year, the outflow shall be increased to 14.6 cfs and further increase to 29.2 cfs after April 15. This outflow shall be maintained until the lake is filled.

- *24. Flow rates during fill period shall be monitored two times per week and reported to the Shirley Conservation Commission on a weekly basis. Rates shall be monitored at the preferred Catacunemaug Road bridge or a compelling reason submitted as to why the location is different.
- *25. Two weeks shall be added to the estimated refill start date noted in Table 1A of the memo sent by Daniel Bourdeau, dated December 31, 2006, to compensate for overestimation of base flow. Thus, for a target drawdown of 6 feet, the estimated refill start date shall be March 1, 2007.
- *26. When drawing down lake levels, pipes shall be opened gradually over two days.
- *27. An annual report shall be submitted to the Shirley Conservation Commission by July 1 of each year detailing when the gates started to open, when they were completely opened, when drawdown depth was achieved and what that depth was, when refilling was initiated, when completed, and flow data during refilling. Monthly precipitation records shall also be submitted, as should any fish kills or other wildlife impacts and/or impacts to shallow wells.
- *28. Adjustments shall be made in subsequent years to ensure compliance with all conditions, subsequent to the July report.
- *29. Increasing the depth of drawdown in subsequent years to 7 feet and 8 feet is contingent upon meeting all requirements for the previous year.
- *30. If pumping is proposed, then the applicant must request an additional amendment. Pumping is not allowed at this time.

F. Appeals

The applicant, the owner, any person aggrieved by this Order, any owner of land abutting the land subject to this Order or any ten residents of the city or town in which such land is located, are hereby notified of their right to request the appropriate DEP Regional Office to issue a Superseding Order of Conditions. The request must be made by certified mail or hand delivery to the Department, with the appropriate filing fee and a completed Request for Departmental Action Fee Transmittal Form, as provided in 310 CMR 10.03 (7) within ten business days from the date of issuance of this Order. A copy of the request shall at the same time be sent by certified mail or hand delivery to the Conservation Commission and to the applicant if he/she is not the appellant. Any appellants seeking to appeal the Department's Superseding Order associated with this appeal will be required to demonstrate prior participation in the review of this project. Previous participation in the permit proceeding means the submission of written information to the Conservation Commission prior to the close of the public hearing, requesting a Superseding Order or Determination, or providing written information to the Department prior to issuance of a Superseding Order or Determination.

The request shall state clearly and concisely the objections to the Order which is being appealed and how the Order does not contribute to the protection of the interests identified in the Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act (M.G.L. c. 131 s. 40) and is inconsistent with the wetlands regulations (310 CMR 10.00). To the extent that the Order is based on a municipal ordinance or bylaw, and not on the Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act or regulations, the Department of Environmental Protection has no appellate jurisdiction.
